# Radio Frequency Safety

**Regulation 7010 B**

### I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this regulation is to establish the district plans to conform with Federal Communications Commission requirements for radio frequency emissions on district premises.

### II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF REGULATION

- A. No additional cell phone antennae that produce radio frequency emissions shall be installed on district premises until December 30, 2015.
- B. Installation of other devices that produce radio frequency emissions on district properties shall conform with the requirements of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).
- C. Operation of cellular communications facilities, or other transmitting antennae shall be based on a properly executed lease of space for this purpose reviewed by district personnel, recommended by the Superintendent and approved by the Board of Directors.
- D. All installations of devices that produce radio frequency shall be inspected no less than every two years to assure that they meet FCC requirements for safe operations.
- E. Parents of students enrolled in schools where installations of devices exist shall be notified annually of the existence of such a device.
- F. Parents of students enrolled in schools where installations of devices are anticipated to be installed shall be notified of such a device.

### III. RESPONSIBILITY

- A. The Superintendent or Superintendent's designee shall report to the Board of Directors no less than every two years on the testing data of radio frequency emissions of all installations on district property.
